Additional Clauses relating to the Game Laws, extracted from Chap. 73, Revised Statutes, Fourth Series.

Section 7. The export from this Province of moose or caribou hides is hereby prohibited and unlawful; and the hides attempted to be exported shall be forfeited; and the owner or person attempting to export the same shall, on conviction, be liable to pay a sum not to exceed five dollars on each hide, to be recovered in the name of any

prosecutor in a summary manner before two Justices of the Peace, and when recovered to go to the prosecutor.

Sec. 8. Any Justice of the Peace, constable or revenue officer may seize hides attempted to be exported under section seven; and it shall be the duty of a Justice of the Peace on information on oath before him to issue a warrant addressed to any constable or peace officer to seize and secure hides so attempted to be exported; and, if the same are not claimed and proved to the satisfaction of the justice issuing the warrant not to be liable to forfeiture within ten days after the seizure, they shall be sold at public auction.

Sec. 9. If the claimant be dissatisfied with the decision of the justice, he may appeal to the Supreme Court; and the appeal shall be heard and determined in a summary way by any of the judges of such

Court.

Sec. 10. The party appealing shall give a bond with sufficient sureties in a penalty of fifteen dollars for every skin so seized as aforesaid, conditioned for the performance of the judgment of the Court of Appeal.

Sec. 11. The proceeds of the sale under section eight shall, after deducting the expenses of the sale and justice's fees, be paid to the

informant or officer who seized the hides.
