

MEMORANDA.

CHURCH SERVICES—At 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. every Lord's Day.

TEACHING SERVICES (including Sabbath School and Pastor's Bible Class)—Every Lord's Day at 3 p.m. All are welcome, and earnestly invited to come.

THE WEEKLY PRAYER MEETING is held every Wednesday evening at 8 o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

THE OFFICE-BEARERS meet every Sabbath morning at 10.15 in the Vestry, for devotional exercises and prayer.

THE YOUNG PEOPLE'S ASSOCIATION meets at the same hour in the Deacons' Court Room, for a similar purpose.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER is dispensed on the last Sabbath of January, March, May, September and November, both morning and evening.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is administered on the first Sabbath of each month.

THE TOPP AUXILIARY OF THE WOMAN'S FOREIGN MISSIONARY SOCIETY meets on the second Tuesday of each month, alternately afternoon and evening.

THE WILLING WORKERS' MISSION BAND meets on the fourth Tuesday afternoon of each month.

THE CHILDREN'S MISSION BAND meets on the second Saturday of each month.

THE YOUNG PEOPLE'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION meets in the Deacon's Court room every second Friday evening at 8 o'clock.

THE ANNUAL MEETING of the congregation for general business is held on the third Wednesday in January.

THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING for the election of Trustees is held on the second Wednesday in March.

THE WHITE ENVELOPES are for the ordinary collections towards the maintenance of the ordinances of the congregation, and can be obtained from Mr. John Duncan, of the White Envelope Committee.

THE BLUE ENVELOPES are for the Schemes of the Church and can be obtained from the Deacons or Mr. John Wanless, Jr., of the Schemes Committee. Contributions to the Schemes should be made on the third Sabbath of each month.
