Quail. Windvogelberg, S. Africa.</p> <p><i>Alcedo cristata</i>. Crested Kingfisher. Banks of Blue River, Cape Town, S. Africa.</p> <p>The nomenclature of the Indian birds is Jerdons, that of the S.
