




The river changed hands five times in one day and at nightfall the stream was completely choked with the bodies of thousands of dead. A plank roadway for artillery was laid by the victorious Russians, across a solid bridge While Attempting Raid--Austrian Sunk **Fighting, With Allies Winning — More** MANY FIRMS AFFECTED Near Dardanelles **Vessels Sunk By Submarines** New York, June &-Four German submarines were captured in the Firth of Tay, on the east coast of Scotland, in a recent raid, according to officers of the liner Gameronia, which arrived from Glasgow today. These undersea craft made a raid up the Firth and passed under the Tay bridge and were caught on their return in nets spread by the port authorities. The submarines were kept entangled sixty-two hours, said Cameronia of-ficers, after which they were allowed to come up. The crews were found to be exhausted and surrendered immediately. Paris, June &-A submarine, believed to be an Austrian, has been sunk by the Angio-French fleet at the western entrance to the Dardanelles, says a de-spatch from Mitylene. The presence of an Austrian submarine in the Darda-nelles sphere would indicate that Austria, as well as Germany, is placing her war supplies at the disposal of the Turks. Outbreak at Noon Hour Brings Paris, June 8-The French War Office this afternoon reported: "North of Arras, there were last evening and last night, some infantry en-tements.
