CHANGES ON THE BASEBALL FIELD

(Toronto Mail and Empire.)
Those who have been privileged to
grasp the hand of the contemporary
professional ball player may have been
astonished to note that it is no more dis-
figured with swollen knuckles and
disfigured joints than the hand of the
average bank clerk. It was far from so
in the olden days. Thirty years ago a
ball player might have been identified
by his hand as infallibly as a prize
fighter by his ear. The New York
Tribune recently printed photographs of
the hands of some of the famous old
timers, especially catchers and infielders,
which showed them to be almost as
crooked as the 1919 White Sox. Hav-
ing done so it continued to muse about
some of the improvements which have
overtaken the national American game.
It was the invention of the baseball
mitt, as distinguished from the base-
ball glove, that saved the hands of sub-
sequent ball players. Credit for this
invention is given to Decker, whom
some old timers may recall as a catcher
for the Toronto team in the days when
