Delboy; Ward 3, Arthur Keith and Walter S. Fairweather. Alderman at large and Aldermen for wards 2 and 3 were elected by acclamation.

Wingham, Ont., Dec. 2.—The North Huron by-election returns complete are: W. H. Fraser, Liberal, 2,890; Dr. T. E. Case, Conservative, 1,877; Geo. Spotton, Independent Conservative, 1,842. Mr. Fraser is therefore elected with 1,118 majority over Case.
