Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.
ANY Person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along the homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption entry for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Games of all kinds, education in many directions, ameliorating influences everywhere, and a close combination of rigid discipline with personal kindness have done wonders with a class which might well be regarded as hopeless.

How well these schools have succeeded with the worst boys of the nation may be inferred from the known results. And I will give the latest obtainable. In the three years of 1905, 1906 and 1907, 3,678 boys were placed out in positions—the army, navy, farming, the mercantile marine, and general labor taking the majority.
