At Montreal, and within St. Andrew's Church there; Friday, the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three years:—

Which day the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted with prayer.

Devotional services were conducted by the Rev. D. M. Gordon. The Minutes of yesterday's Diet were read and sustained.

REPORT OF DELEGATE TO THE C. P. ASSEMBLY.

Mr. Muir, appointed at last meeting a Delegate to the General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, reported that he had fulfilled this appointment—had been received in a cordial manner—and had conveyed to that Body the fraternal greetings of this Synod. Mr. Muir was thanked for the able manner in which he had discharged this duty.

BEQUEST BY MRS. MCINTYRE.

Dr. Bain stated that the late Mrs. McIntyre, of Perth, a member of his congregation and widow of the late John McIntyre, Esq., B.A., had (besides a legacy to Queen's College for the establishment of a Bursary) bequeathed to the Church the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400), to be appropriated to such Scheme or Schemes of the Church as the Synod shall think best. Dr. Bain further stated that he expected the Executors would soon be in a position to pay this sum to the Synod and moved, seconded by Dr. Jenkins, that of the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400), thus bequeathed the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) be appropriated to the General Sustentation Fund, one hundred dollars (\$100) to the Ministers' Widows' and Orphans' Fund, fifty dollars (\$50) to the French Mission and one hundred dollars (\$100) to the Manitoba Mission, and that the receipts of the Treasurers of these Schemes be a discharge from the Synod to the Executors. The Synod unanimously resolved to decern in terms of this motion and to record their appreciation of the warm interest manifested by the deceased lady in measures intended to promote the prosperity of this Church and the extension of religion.

APPLICATION OF THE REV. F. NICOL.

There was read an Extract Minute of the Presbytery of Toronto, transmitting an application of the Rev. Francis Nicol, desiring to have his claim on the congregational department of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund from the contributions to that Fund made by the congregation of London during his incumbency recognized.
