The Koch Remedy.

According to a Berlin despatch, official government statistics have been prepareb of 2,172 cases of tuberculosis treated by the Koch method from the middle of November to the end of December. Of cases of internal tuberculosis, 13 are reported cured, 171 considerably improved, 194 improved and 46 died. Of cases of external tuberculosis, 15 are reported cured, 148 considerably improved, 237 improved and 9 died.

Foretelling Storms.

The telephone is about to have a new application—that of foretelling storms.

A new discovery has been made as to one of the properties of this means of transmitting sound. By placing two iron bars at seven or eight meters, distance from each other, and then putting them in communication on one side by a copper wire covered with rubber, and on the other side with a telephone, a storm can be predicted at least 12 hours advances the sound resembles the beating of large hailstones against the windows, Every flash of lightning and, of course, every clap of thunder that accompanies the storm produces a shock similar to that of the stroke of a stone cast between the diaphragm and the instrument.
