the orchard which has been heretofore neglected.

I enclose a breed bill to give you an idea of the quantity of food consumed at the Institute for month in which half the children were on their holidays. The cakes and buns are sold at half price because they are stale but at the Institute they steam them and thus make palatable dishes of them. They do not make their own bread as they find it cheaper to buy it as do all the other public Institutions in Brantford. As the girls are largely used for kitchen work under the cook, it has been found that through their carelessness or ignorance a batch of bread was occasionally spoiled and when baked in large quantities this would be a serious waste.
