DANISH WEST INDIES' TREATY

Text of the Document--Islanders Mav Retain Allegiance to Denmark if They Give Notice Within Two Years-Property Arrangements.

Washington, Feb. 6.—The text of the treaty for the cession of the Danish West Indies to the United States for \$5,00,000 in gold has been made public. It is provided that the payment must be made within its months of the date of the treaty, which is January 24, ultimo. The most important provisions are as follows:

It is agreed that the consummation of said cession does not import the transference to the United States of the financial claims now held by Demarks against the colonial treasures of the islands, it being agreed that these claims are altogether extinguished in consequence of the cession. And it is moreover understood and agreed that the United States will assume and continue to disclarge from the date of the cession the obligations herectofore incumbent upon the Danish government towards the St. Thomas Floating Dock Company and the West Indian and Panama Telegraph Company.
