LONDON, May 6.

The dock laborers have joined the sailors of Southampton in a strike, which causes great inconvenience. The strikers gather in large crowds and make noisy demonstrations. A detachment of police has been sent from London to assist authorities in preserving order.

No confirmation of reported capture of Don Chies.

Report of French Commission on capitulation censures officers who commanded at Toul, Laon, and Soissons, because they surrendered to the Germans troops they neglected to spike guns on fortifications.

On Monday two hundred and fifty Communists sailed from New Caledonia to serve out their sentences.

Steamer Tabasco has arrived at Rio Grande with several hundred Government troops.

Cavalry's available force is now about 3,000 regulars and 1,000 national guards.

Martinez is coming with 2,000 cavalry to join Terreno and Quiroga, when another advance will be made on this city.
