The cars, one being a box car, were of different heights at the place of coupling and when they were jammed into the narrow space causing it to be torn very severely. A dispatch received by John E. Ganong to-day gives however the gratifying intelligence that the injured man is all right and will be ready to resume duty in a few days.

Snow-drifts on the Intercolonial Railway.
A special train left Halifax on Wednesday night, on board of which were Mr. Coleman, Superintendent of the Eastern and Central Divisions of the Intercolonial, and several other officials. The train was stopped by a snow-drift on the track near the station. The snow was piled up to the height of several feet, and the train was unable to proceed. The snow-drifts were caused by a heavy snow-storm which had prevailed since the previous evening.
