

"Rab and His Friends."

Craft is Kept Upright by Water Ballast

Numerous desirable features have been combined in a new type of life raft, shown in the Popular Mechanical Magazine, that makes it distinctive among the many inventions of this character. The raft is of dual con struction, the underside being a du-plicate of the upper side, so that, no matter which way it is thrown into the water, a "right side" floats upper-most. Above and below a central framework of heavy timbers, that makes it practically unsinkable, is a low wall encircling seats for eight or more. Water which washes over the side flows off through drains terminating in valves that permit an out-ward flow only. In the centre of the raft are two large metal cylinders, rait are two large metal cylinders, one in the upper side and one in the lower side, placed end to end, the ad-jacent ends being open and the oppo-site ends closed. The cylinder in the underside rapidly fills with water when the raft is afloat, acting as bal-loat, while the correction on empiric last, while the opposite one remains filled with air though partly immers-ed, and helps keep the raft upright, Oars are provided and there is storage space for provisions.
