Copy of a DESPATCH from Viscount Goderich to Governor the Earl of Mulgrave.

My Lord,

Downing-street, 21 February 1833.

With reference to my despatch dated the 8th of December last, I have the 21 February 1833. honour to acquaint your Lordship, that several Acts passed by the Governor, No. 3,019 to 3,022. Council and General Assembly of the island of Jamaica, in the years 1831 and No. 3,032 to 3,035. No. 3,032 to 3,035. No. 3,037 to 3,068; omitting Nos. 3,040. Council for the Affairs of Trade and Foreign Plantations, the Lords of that 3,043. 3,046, 3,047. Committee have reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion, that the Acts 3,051, 3,052. 3,061 and 3,066. numbered as in the margin should be left to their operation, and that the Acts No. 3,020, Jewish numbered respectively 3,051 and 3,061 should be disallowed; and I have the Disabilities Bill. honour herewith to transmit to your Lordship two Orders of his Majesty in Council, dated respectively the 4th instant, approving that Report, with a copy of so much of the Report of the Privy Council for Trade, upon the two lastmentioned Acts, as explains the grounds upon which His Majesty was advised to disallow the same.
