XXII. And be it enacted, That the Master of every Ship bound Entry outfrom any British Possession abroad, except the Territories subject to wards of the Government of the Presidencies of Fort William in Bengal, Fort Cargo. Saint George, and Bombay, shall, before any Goods be laden therein deliver to the Collector or Comptroller, or other proper Officer, an Entry Outwards under his Hand of the Destination of such Ship, stating her Name, Country, and Tonnage, and, if British, the Port of Particulars Registry, the Name and Country of the Master, the Country of the of Entry. XXIII.
