the Title Deeds. 4°. The circumstances of the Dohations, and the quality of the Donors would alone prove that to be their intention. The Canadians, considered as Catholics, have therefore a Right to those estates,
which appears incontestible. 5°. The instruction of the Savages, and
the subsistence of their Missionaries, appearing to have greatly actuated
the Donors of those Estates, is it not sit that the Bishop of Quebec,
who names those Missionaries, should have it in his power to decide in
their favour, respecting the application of that part of the said Estates,
which shall have been found to have been given with that intent, rather
than see them burdensome to Government, as many of them have been
for some years? Therefore, in preserving the Estates of the Jesuits to
the Canadians under the authority of the Bishop, he would have a right
to cause this essential part of the intention of the Donors to be executed; and it is besides very probable that the College and the Public
would become gainers by it.
