exempted by this Act; and the Master of any such vessel shall forthwith deliver all letters on board to such person on his demanding the same.

XXII. And be it enacted, That the Postmaster General, with the approbation of the General to es-Lieutenant Governor and Council, shall esta- tablish new way offices, &c. blish new Way Offices and Post Offices, over and above the regular Post Offices and Way Offices now established; and every person employed at Persons emsuch Way Offices or Post Offices shall be liable ployed therein to all the penalties imposed by this Act on Postmasters and other Officers of the Post Officers. fice, and shall be entitled to such remuneration Remuneration. for their services as shall be allowed by the Lieutenant Governor and Council.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That the Post-Postmaster master General, with the concurrence of the General may Lieutenant Governor in Council, may enter into agreements, an agreement with, and take security from any best accommon person applying to him, to extend the accomdation. modations of the posts to any place for indemnifying the revenue against the expenses which shall be incurred thereby, beyond the amount of postages received.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That the Lieutenant Governor in Council may enter into arrangements or conventional agreements with arrangements any other of the North American Colonies, or A. Colonies, &c. with any foreign country, for the transmission of newspapers, of Colonial or foreign newspapers, or other &c. printed papers, within, to, or from, or through this Island, upon such terms or conditions as shall be just or reasonable, and shall be empowered to carry out such arrangements or conventional agreements, by Order in Council duly published, as herein directed.
