Extract from a letter from Professor A. F. McGoun,  
formerly "Economics", University of Alberta. He is  
writing a series of articles in the Conservative interest  
for the Press dealing with things economic, social credit  
and so forth.

"Let me thank you also for Mr. Meighen's address  
on Shakespeare. I was delighted with it. Shakespeare  
was a great Conservative. His attack on Jack Cade  
in Henry VI was perfect, and he was a consistent  
patriot and monarchist. We ought to make more of a  
national hero of Henry V, although his Conquest of  
France may not commend itself to some Quebecers. But  
Mr. Meighen's directing attention in the way he has  
done seems to me highly constructive, and the  
address is so admirable that it may produce far-reaching  
results. I wish our schools would study more Shakespeare,  
and devote less time to "Civics" as expounded by in-  
experienced but politically aspiring teachers."
