Sir,

With reference to the right of way of the Canadian Northern Pacific Railway through Cheam Indian Reserve, B.C., I beg to say that company desires to have a patent for the Indian interest in the said lands. They were informed on Aug. 20, 1912, that the trail and road from the river to the village was to be repaired, that the canoe landing was to be fixed and that the spring from which the reserve water supply was derived was to be put in order. Please report as to whether the company has executed these works to the satisfaction of yourself and the Indians. It is desired that you attend to this matter at your earliest convenience as the patent cannot issue until after your report has been received.
