They were informed on Aug. 20, 1912, that the trail and road from the river to the village was to be repaired, that the cance landing was to be fixed and that the spring from which the reserve water supply was derived was to be put in order. Please report as to whether the company has executed these works to the estisfaction of yourself and the Indians. It is desired that you attend to this matter at your earliest convenience as the patent cannot issue until after your report has been received.
