



Dear Sir,

I have your letter of the 17th instant, with reference to shipment made to Mr. Michael Buckshot, of Barry's Bay. Will you kindly note that this man is an Indian and no further orders should be taken from him. You do not mention the firm to whom you transferred the order. They are liable to a heavy penalty for furnishing liquor to Indians. They should be careful of any orders coming from Golden Lake or vicinity and give instructions that shipments are not to be delivered by express or freight agents if the consignees are known to be Indians.
