E. 80 chains, thence N. 80 chains, thence W. 80 chains to point of commencement containing 640 acres more or less

(2.) "A narrow strip of land on the E. side of Lillooet River extending from No 4 reserve S. to reserve No 11 of Douglas band to connect up these reserves & furnish some much needed grazing lands. The grazing is very inferior but the best which can be had. The Inds ask that the strip be 120 chains wide stretching up hill from the river bank. This area contains old & ^{two} new reserves so the amount of additional land asked would not be very great. The desire is to have all the reserves in one strip or piece as well as obtain pasture."

(3.) "A piece of land for agricultural purposes on the W. bank of Lillooet river described as follows "commencing at N.E. corner of timber licence No 2122 thence W. 40 chains, thence N. 90 chains more or less to W. bank of Lillooet river."

(4.) "Extension of No 3 reserve southwards to take in an old homestead of Purcell Bros. (Half broods) at Warm Springs. There is no other land of any good which can be got for enlargement of No 3 reserve."

(see applications of this band to Royal Com. (Report p. Fishing, Hunting, trapping Fishing, Hunting, Trapping) The band presented a statement on these matters as follows

- (1) "We want agricultural & pasture land sufficient for our needs."
- (2) "We need an "irrigation system" or irrigation water for our lands."
- (3) "We need assistance from the gov. in improving our lands &c. viz a steam donkey to pull stumps & for other purposes, some ploughs, harrrows
