beautiful as to seem to those who received them or knew of them almost like a fairy tale. One person was heard to say that she could kiss the hem of her garment. The most sensitive were willing to receive from one who gave not only money but love. She gave herself to all who needed her. So extraordinary was her unselfishness that on her death-bed, and just before she lapsed into unconsciousness, she seemed more concerned for the comfort of the friends who stood around her than for herself. Her spirit was that of her Master, who "came not to be ministered unto, but to minister." "She saved others, herself she could not save."

And now that this Christian woman, this friend, this helper in all good work, is gone from us, to all of us life is poorer, and to one it must seem that the light is gone out of life. But she has left to the community an inspiring example, to her family and friends memories and influences which must ever lead them onward and upward.
