

**M**OLL'S (Herman) THE WORLD DESCRIBED, or a NEW AND CORRECT SET OF MAPS, showing the states in all the known parts of the earth, with the principal cities and most considerable towns in the world, etc., thirty large and very fine old maps, including the Hemispheres and six others of which relate to THE NEW WORLD, COLORED, with many curious old engravings, engraved titles, etc., and abounds with letterpress descriptions which combine to make this scarce old atlas A MOST DESIRABLE ACQUISITION, tall folio, calf, 25.50, 1708-1720.

Includes Map of the World in two Hemispheres; Map of the whole World, with vignette titles and 6 American Maps, as follows: 1. Map of North America, with vignette title, with Indians, engraved by Virtue; and engraving of the fishing, curing and drying cod at Newfoundland, and two small plans of Harbours (California is shown as an Island, and the Gulf is called Red Sea), 38 by 23 inches, 1708. 2. Map of the Dominions of the King of Great Britain on the Continent of North America, containing Newfoundland, New Holland, New England, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, Carolina, (and part of Louisiana) with interesting engraved notes on map, others on margin, "Account of ye Posts of the Continent of North America," "Rights of French and English of Newfoundland Fisheries," interesting view of Niagara Falls, and industry of the beavers in making dams in Canada, etc., 40 by 24 inches, 1715. 3. North parts of America claimed by France, under ye names of Louisiana, Mississippi, Canada and New France, with adjoining territories of England and Spain, with with letterpress and curious view of Indian Port of Sasquahannock, and Margin Map of Harbour of Annapolis, and another of Mouth of Mississippi and Mobile Rivers, 40 by 24 inches, 1720. 4. The West Indies, or the Islands of America in the North Sea, with the adjacent Countries, showing what belongs to Spain, England, France, etc., also the Trade Winds, and several tracts made by the Galleons and Flota from place to place, also a view of the City of Mexico, in New Spain, 40 by 24 inches. 5. South America with a prospect view of Mount Potosi, and a description of the mines, with vignette title of Indians, engraved by Virtue, 38 by 24 inches. 6. Map of the Coast Countries and Islands of the South Sea Company, 26 by 20 inches. The notes and explanations on the above Maps, and which contain very interesting and curious matter, would fill a small volume. The Map of Europe is dedicated to Queen Caroline, with vignette title, containing her portrait, and views of Indians.
