FRESH FASHIONS.

THE NEW DECORATIVE DETAILS ARE MANY AND FASCINATING.

Tucks, Ruchings, Frills and Folds All in Favor—Silver Braid and Chenille Cord and Fringe to Be Used. The Skirt of the Season.

Tucks, tucks, everywhere tucks, also ruchings and a new narrow, corrugated frill. A sort of crossway fold outlined with braid is another novelty. Braids, especially silver braid, in spring costumes are to be used by miles, and chenille cords and fringes are introduced in great quantities. Some of these decorative details are well shown in the two lovely spring toilets here illustrated. A shell pink tulle dress is set off with old fashioned ruffles edged with

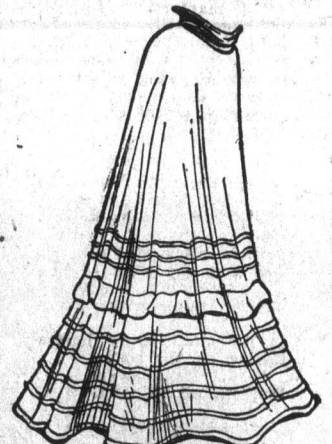
spring green velvet ribbon like the vandike of the treble flounces round the sleeves in embroidered muslin. The neck and shoulder tabs are adorned with embroidery, together with green silk stitching and ribbon. Tea roses and a chiffon chon on either side of the tilted brim bedeck the plate shaped straw hat which is outlined with black. Stitched tucks and a deep belt relieved with silver galleons, connected together with herringbone in red chenille, trim the dainty gray velvet confection. A rich chenille fringe dangles from the shoulder cape and skirt flounce, both enhanced with openwork. Silver and chenille cord tipped with gimp olivettes droops on either side of the front of the bolero bodice, from under the smart rabat and fan shaped plaits in cream embroidered tulle. Around the low brim of the hat in coarse fancy straw blooms a wreath of radiant pink roses and foliage, with a floral aigret at either side.

Although skirts for the season are decidedly full, so skillfully are they cut that the awkward bulk so generally associated with the idea of fullness is entirely avoided. The material is gored in such manner as to hang in heavy but graceful folds from the waist to the hem.

The present sketch is designed for light cloth, serge hopsack or cashmere, and is indeed suitable for practicality and all the fashionable fabrics. It is cut the accepted length for town walking wear, just clearing the ground, and bears as trimming many rows of ribbon.

This same ribbon represents one of the most up to date forms of decoration and is employed equally in the satin and taffeta varieties, run simply to the skirt at the upper edge and left unattached at the lower.
