The Experimental Farms Report

The information contained in the Annual Reports of the Experimental Farms of the Dominion Department of Agriculture is so varied and complete as to render these yearly volumes almost worthy the name of 'Encyclopaedia of Agriculture.' The Experimental Farms System embraces the Central Farm and twenty Branch Farms and Stations, each managed by a staff of specialists. At these wide-spread, well-equipped institutions practically every phase of Agriculture, from the study and suppression of plant diseases to the breeding and raising of all manner of orchard, garden and field crops and classes of farm animals, are taken up. In addition, seven outlying sub-stations carry on and report upon work of an agricultural nature.

The report of the year ending March 31st, 1913, makes a volume of 700 pages crammed with the most of what was accomplished and found out during the year. The information is so classified and treated as to be readily available to the reader in whatever subject he may chance to be interested. A large edition has been printed so as to supply for some time at least every applicant who will drop a card for a copy to the Publications Branch, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

ON CURRENT COMMONPLACES.

Mr. Frederick Abraham, an authority on the subject, addressing the Montreal Publicity Association briefly stated his idea in regard to a general clean up, point up week as follows: 'To be set apart each year for a general public and private house cleaning to engender a spirit of enthusiasm in the public mind by advertising extensively the five word slogan: "Clean up and paint up." Everybody, old and young would be asked to lend a helping hand for a few hours at least to put every street, alley, yard, cellar, passageway, back lot and corner in spick and span trim. Experiences in other places indicate that when property owners have once cleaned up their property, they are very apt to keep up the good work, by cleaning at regular periods.'

The Halifax Civic Improvement League is in line, co-operating with the City Press and other organizations. Mr. E. J. Kelly, the league's secretary, encloses the scheme in the following words: 'I feel certain that the civic authorities, including the members of the Board of Health, should strongly support the scheme as they have proved the epidemic last year proved a costly lesson to the city and there was no doubt but that such an epidemic was largely due because of the filthy condition of many premises.'

From a Toronto paper I cull the following: 'Next Friday will be Day, Moving Day and Clean up Day—a triple bill for the enjoyment of the people of this city. It may be difficult for some families to participate heartily in a thorough clean-up of external premises while the front lawns are more or less covered with articles of furniture in process of transfer to or from other quarters, but, in their wisdom, the City Council have declared May 1st as the official, annual cessation when citizens are not only asked, but expected, to clean up their outdoor premises, front, back and sides, in workman-like shape, lock, stock and barrel.'

To the progressive citizens of Kings County the Good Roads Association makes this appeal: Help Us.

This is not a request for you to contribute money, although we assure you we would be pleased to have you take out an annual membership ticket which will be sent you on receipt of one dollar.

Public interest will help more than dollars. We want practical suggestions from all over the county. Already we are in receipt of a number of suggestions. Here is one:

'Urge upon farmers the benefit it means to them to have a good road from their farms to their shipping and shopping centers. Ask them to co-operate more heartily than they have been doing with their road surveyors. Show them that it will be time well spent if they hitch their team to a split log drag AFTER EVERY RAIN and drag the road that runs by their property and suggest that they ask their neighbor to take up the dragging where they leave off.'

Here is suggestion number two: 'Automobiles are hard on our roads and automobile owners should take a more active interest than they do in keeping up the roads. Whenever a road is in need of repair let the car owner offer him say twenty miles use of his auto for a picnic trip.'

In line with this suggestion, one car owner, Mr. Burpee L. B. shop, of Greenwich, has already offered to give several such prizes.

'Get the local government to give The Good Roads Association the amount of money paid in automobile taxes for the improvement of the roads in the county from which the tax is paid.'

'The Association is going after that money. We want more suggestions and we want more members. But no matter whether you are a member or not send in a suggestion.'

This above all: Do your full duty in your own section and if you happen to do a little more work than the law calls for you will have a satisfaction within yourself worth more than money.'

There was also missing one of the best horses and a pig. The team was located during the day at Lake George, twelve miles south of Berwick, where it had been sold by Waugh to a Mr. Wier for \$150. Constable Thomas, of Berwick, secured the outfit and brought it to Wolfville where it was identified by Mr. Hutchinson. Waugh was located at Truro where he was arrested at the instance of the Wolfville authorities. Armed with a warrant for his arrest, Constable Thomas on Monday morning and returned in the evening with his man. Waugh was brought before Magistrate Crawley on Wednesday morning and after hearing the evidence he was sent up for trial at the next session of the Supreme Court at Kentville. The accused claims to be sixteen years of age. He is a stranger in these parts.
