

The party set out for Labrador on July 14 from Lonsburg and after a narrow escape with their lives when their motor boat ran aground on the return trip, they are back in civilization again to report that they did not find the timber they were looking for. Edwards declared they had been told they would find the best of pulp timber but he found nothing but scrub spruce. "It is too cold for anything else to grow there," he said.
"The Bellows leave here to investigate New Brunswick properties."
I know of several cruising trips to Labrador costing thousands of dollars, and with the exception of some promoter who was trying to fool the public into buying stock in some wild cat scheme, they all report the same. I have seen samples of wood landed from there and they were small, crooked and very brittle, running a hundred and fifty to two hundred years growth to a five inch diameter tree.
The dangers of navigation, with icebergs in July and August, the short season, cold climate in winter and heat in the short summer with fleas and mosquitoes big freshets in the spring owing to depth of snow and great barren country allowing the snow to all go off with a rush, distance and expense of transporting men at high wages are all inducements to go to that desolate barren country and great cost of shipping supplies make it an impossible proposition even if there was wood in any quantity.
My friend Dr. Cabot explored that country more than any other man having spent fourteen seasons down there says there is nothing doing for any wood operations.
