

Sixty-Mile Gold Line Found in Australia

London, Feb. 14.—Is western Australia on the verge of a gold mining boom?

There have been so many wildcat schemes in the past that people are chary of crediting stories of new finds. In the present instance, however, there is a certain amount of official confirmation of the authenticity of the new fields.

The Hon. J. D. Connolly, agent general for western Australia, has received information from his government that the recent finds in a direct line from Kalgoorlie cover a distance of about sixty miles, a stretch of gold bearing formation longer than anything of the kind hitherto realized in Australia.

A more recent report from Kalgoorlie, too, records the first indications of a fresh field in which the samples from a lode that has been struck are reported to have given extremely high values, but the width of the lode is not yet known.

Lincoln County Gives E \$300

Municipalities \$600 Themselves; tee's Re

The County Council adjourned on the 12th when the business of the County Road System was discussed.

The County Council on County Road System report, with recommendations of the Road Superintendent, advised and we recommend that this Committee.

We recommend that the Board of the Annual Conference on Road Systems be paid.

We recommend that the members of the Annual Convention Association in Toronto, March 10th, be invited to the County Road System committee fees and expenses. The requests to have a portion of the County in Lincoln and Niagara Townships, a portion of the Village of West from the Village of Louth to be connected in the Village of Louth being more particularly in the Village of Louth, be granted and the County System, and the Chairman of the Village of Louth to this effect.

That the old stone road running between Lots 16 and 17 in South North Grimsby from Road 1 to Grimsby Village be included in the County Road System.

That the Warden, Reeve and Committee, and Reeve Welstead be authorized to buy all materials required for this work.

That the Purchasing Committee, and also report with present machinery not required for the County Road System, be a Committee to wait upon the County of Wentworth to ask their consent to connect up 1.14 mile between Roads 5 and 6 and if agreeable, it be taken in as a County Road.

That the Reeves of the various Municipalities be a committee to act in conjunction with the Chairman of the County Road System, and that all those roads under construction, included in last year's program, be completed as soon as possible.

That Councillor Welstead and Mr. Gorman be instructed to inquire into the cost of exchanging the County Car for a new one and report at the next sitting of this Council.

That the Township of Louth be authorized to purchase a limited quantity of crushed stone from the Ball Quarry on the opinion of the Road Superintendent, the stone to be quarried at the quarry.

That if the Chairman and Superintendent consider it advisable, to employ an assistant to the Superintendent, they be empowered to secure such an assistant.

This resolution was passed: That whereas the Dominion Government have organized the federal outwork appropriation fund to be administered through the Canadian Patriotic Fund; and whereas it is not considered advisable to open up an account for the County of Lincoln separate from St. Catharines Branch of the Patriotic Fund; and whereas the St. Catharines branch is willing to administer the total fund for the County of Lincoln, but ask the cooperation of Lincoln County Patriotic Fund organization; it is resolved that St. Catharines Patriotic Fund in every way possible to obtain the desired ends for which this fund was set apart, that of supplying soldiers and their families, and that the Reeves of the municipalities undertake the same responsibilities that they did under
