THE ANNUAL FAIR HELD AT VEGREVILLE

Eighth Annual Exhibition of Vermilion Valley and Beaver Lake Agricultural Society Was Great Success

Vegreville, Oct. 2.—(Special to the Bulletin)—The 8th annual fair of the Vermilion Valley and Beaver Lake Agricultural Society, which was held on Friday last, provided one of the finest exhibitions of stock and agricultural produce ever held in the province. The weather was of the first order, the rain of the previous evening only served to lay the dust of the trails, and the sun streaming out in all the brilliancy of a summer morning served to entice over a thousand interested spectators out. An unusually large number of visitors attended from outside points along the railways, the special excursion from Edmonton being fully taken advantage of.

The directors decided to run the fair this year by way of an experiment as an exhibition purely of farm stock and agricultural produce, and are to be congratulated on the success their adventure attained.

The exhibit of heavy horses especially was enough to make one feel a few inches taller, and served to make the people of the district straighten up their shoulders with pride as they gazed with looks of wonder and extreme satisfaction at the quality of horseflesh with which the district evidently abounded. There were seventeen registered horses from the stables of Vanstone and Rogers of Wainwright, Man., although no opportunity of competing in any of the classes had been provided for horse dealers, but these served to show the high standard of horses which the Vegreville district possesses. These horses joined in the parade, which was one of the finest spectacles seen in the province, in fact, seen in any part of Canada.

Hughson Bros. stallion "Torment-

or" was awarded first place again this year over all competitors in the Clydesdale class. It was also noticeable that the Ruthenian Clyde colts were awarded first place among all comers. The offspring of "Tom Bell," a registered Clyde owned by D. G. Rose, was in evidence.

The vegetable and grain exhibits were something wonderful for quantity, for quality and for size. The display of potatoes, cabbages, pumpkins, celeris, turnips, squashes, etc., was perhaps one of the best to be found anywhere. There were tomatoes and crab apples all the way from Big Fish Lake north of the river, which provided the farmers with wonderful visions of the fruit-growing possibilities of the future of the province. Not behind the vegetable exhibit in quantity and size nor beneath them in quality, came the grains and the grasses.
