## The New Ocean Peril.

The appalling nature of the disaster to the S. S. Titanic is enough to stagger humanity. Marine Engineering was believed to have reached such a pitch of perfection that the Titanic was spoken of as "unsinkable." Yet something happens and she is no more, and some 1,200 or 1,300 souls perish whom all the world believed were as safe on board the latest levisible and if they were at home in their athan as if they were at home in their own beds. Once again, proud man boastful of his powers is abased by the mysteries of Nature. It would appear that even such knowledge as marine engineers have secured is liaable to be set at naught and is fraught with dangers as colossal as the forces which man attempts to control. For a generation no liner of the first rank has been sent to the bottom. But now the greatest wonder of them and the latest of them all is buried in the vasty deep of the Atlantic. How the accident occurred is but known in part. She struck ice and sunk shortafterwards. But that only adds to the mystery of it all, and the news that her officers were warned on Friday afternoon of the presence makes the disaster still more mysterious. May it be that the accident which happened to H. M. S. Hawke and the Olympic, and the accident which occurred to the New York afford a key to the problem. It will be remembered that the suction of the S. S. Olympic last year drew the H. M. S. With such terrible forces in play what would happen say to a "growler" of 30,000 tons, floating freely and almost immersed on a dark night near the path of the great leviathan of 60,000 tons, racing along at 22 knots? Does it not appear to follow that this tremendous force would drag such a growler under the bottom of the linand like an immense plane, driven by an almost inconceivably high momentum over a gigantic growler, her double bottom and her sides were torn out of her for a furlong or so. This is but a surmise. It is quite possibility in view of what is now known of the immense force of suction generated by the passage of such great leviathans at a high speed. 
