GERTIE O'ROURKE.

At the R. C. Church this morning a Requiem High Mass was celebrated for the repose of the soul of Gertie O'Rourke. The Mass was given by the promoters of the League of the Sacred Heart as the only fitting tribute which they could pay to the memory of her who had been the chief worker in the establishment of the League, and who had laboured as an zealous promoter for the interests of the Sacred Heart and the welfare of the people among whom she dwelt.

For over three years Gertie O'Rourke had taught in the Superior School here with the success which was to be expected from one so highly gifted by nature, and her brilliant talents combined with a modest and retiring disposition won for her the esteem of all with whom she came in contact. Trouble on the Florizel.

STOKER SERIOUSLY WOUNDED BY TWO DAGOS.

It was reported in the city early yesterday morning that a man had been assassinated on board the Red Cross Liner Florizel. The Telegram made enquiries and found that an attempt had been made but that no loss of life resulted. The perpetrators of the deed are two "Dagos" who are employed as cooks on the steamer, and the victim, Stan Babstock, who was a fireman on the same ship. The trouble occurred on board Saturday midnight as the Florizel was ready for sea and work of loading her was being rushed. Several of the ship's crew were celebrating. Babstock paid a visit to the alleyway of the ship where the "Dagos" were. Some stiff talk was exchanged and an altercation followed. It is alleged that one held him while the other kicked him and struck several blows about the head and body with a cleaver of some sort of a machine the "Dago" used for chopping meat. There was general disorder among the rest of the firemen, who knew nothing of the happening in the cook house. Later Babstock was picked up in the alleyway, apparently lifeless. His entire body was badly scarred, one wound across the forehead was deep and long and seven stitches were inserted to close it. The back of his head, face and arms were also a mass of cuts. Babstock is now at his home in a serious condition. To substantiate the belief of the "Dagos" fierce treatment, we were told by two of the Florizel's crew that the last time the ship was in New York the three men referred to had a dispute and the "Dagos" were heard to say that they would have revenge on Babstock no matter what happened, and in brutal fashion they got it. It is not yet known whether the perpetrators will be held up in Halifax.

Fake Alarm.

At 2.30 p.m. on Saturday W. Gallivan, of Duckworth Street, ran to the East End Fire Hall and reported that his house, occupied by a man named Wheeler, was on fire. Immediately an alarm rung out and the Central men responded. Owing to the high wind prevailing and fearing disastrous results, Inspector General Sullivan, Supt. Grimes and several policemen were on the scene. All the trouble was for nothing, however, as the only sign of fire discovered was smoke from a chimney. The firemen were indignant. Within the past 12 months this is the second fake alarm they have been caught in by this same individual.

Fishery News.

The latest fishery news from the north is encouraging and from Capt. Barbour of the Fogota, we hear that excellent fishing is being done north of Twillingate while at other places average catches are taken. Owing to the scarcity of bait handlers are not doing much but there are some traps that have taken so far this season as high as 280 qts.

An Express Marriage.

Los Angeles Capitalist Takes a Wife When Travelling Fifty Miles an Hour.

Medford, Ore., June 3.—W. E. Kellar, of Los Angeles, a well-known capitalist of that city and president of the Globe Grain and Milling Company of San Francisco, was married Saturday to his third wife while en route to Portland on a train of the Southern Pacific. The bride is Miss Helen Mary Pife, of Memphis, Tenn., also a passenger from San Francisco on the north bound train.

Kellar telegraphed ahead to Medford, impressing the local station agent into service, and through the latter's persuasions, a clergyman and a deputy county clerk with the necessary legal forms boarded the train when it reached the city. The preliminaries were immediately disposed of, and the marriage was performed as the train rushed on its way between Medford and the next station north at over fifty miles an hour.
