Sixty thousand Catholics and Protestants of Berlin, after a mass meeting on Thursday, marched in procession to the Ministry of Public Worship where there was a demonstration against Adolf Hoffman, who holds that portfolio, say advices from the German capital. Dr. Karl Liebknecht and Rosa Luxemburg, the Radical leaders, were also targets for the crowd's anger. As the throng marched along the streets it sang, "Deutschland Uber Allies." After reaching the building, entry was gained and a large number of people searched for Hoffman, but he was not found. The crowd then dispersed.

RIGA IN BOLSHEVIK HANDS.

COPENHAGEN, Jan. 4. Riga is in the hands of the Lithunian Sovett troops, according to a wireless despatch from the Russian Bolsheviki headquarters.
