### With Military Honors.

Church Lads' Brigade, Avalon Battalion of the First Nfld. Regt. Church Lads' Brigade paraded at their Headquarters at 2.15 p.m. yesterday for the purpose of attending the funeral of the late Bugler William J. Churchill, of the Brigade's Bugle Band. The Battalion was in charge of the Lieut.-Colonel Commanding, Colonel R. F. Goodridge, and the following officers paraded: Majors Raley, M.C., Adj. and G. R. Williams, Captain Avalon Goodridge, Lieut. Lance Hayward, Harold Hayward, Rev. E. H. Fletcher, W. R. Moty, Phil B. Rendell and Regt. Sergt. Major Rowland Williams. The brass and bugle bands were present, the former in charge of Captain Morris, and the latter in charge of Corporal Cook. The battalion marched to the home of the parents, Monkstown Road and thence proceeded to the Church cemetery near Quidi Vidi. Leaving the home the band played The Dead March in Saul, followed by the hymn "Nearer My God to Thee." The casket rested on a gun carriage, kindly loaned the Brigade by the O.C., H.M.S. Briton, and the officers are grateful for the courtesy. The gun carriage crew was in charge of Co. Sergt. Major Rendell, and did their work with great satisfaction. At the entrance to Forest Road the band again played the solemn music of the Dead March, and the hymn, "Jesu Lover of My Soul" very effectively; and the burial service was read by Rev. Capt. Clayton, C.F., and Rev. C. A. Moulton of the C.L.B. In the Chapel the Brigade hymn was sung "Fight the Good Fight." At the graveside the full military honors were given. The firing party in charge of Sergt. E. Best, gave three volleys, and Bugler Cook sounded the "Last Post" as the remains of their beloved comrade was consigned to Mother Earth "until the day dawns and the shadows flee away." The late Bugler Churchill was an active member, and participated in last year's camp at Topsall, and at that time looked as healthy as any lad in camp. He was formerly employed in the Postal Telegraph Department until his recent illness. His comrades of the C.L.B. greatly regret his passing, none more so than the Lt.-Col. Commanding, Capt. Avalon Goodridge, and the officers and lads who visited his bedside during his illness. The Brigade sent three floral tributes, one each from the officers' mess, No. 4 section, A Co., and Bugle Band and the N.C.O.'s mess. The Brigade extends its sympathy to the bereaved parents, with the knowledge that his soul is at rest with God. "Father, in Thy gracious keeping, Leave we now Thy servant sleeping."
