

SAGONA HAD GOOD RUN.

SAGONA HAD GOOD RUN. The Sagona arrived at the terminal wharf at 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon from Port aux Basques, after a splendid run of 2 1/2 hours. She carried 81 passengers, 25 of whom were first class. Among the second class passengers were a batch of 30 fishermen who are going to Ingonish where they will be employed on the plant of the Robin Jones & Whitman Co., of Halifax. The trip across was a most delightful one. There were ten children and about the same number of ladies among the passengers. A very small number of packages of fish were landed. The Sagona sailed on return last evening at 8 o'clock with 35 passengers, four cars of freight and one cattle.

TO BE DEPORTED.

TO BE DEPORTED. For evasion of the immigration laws by not reporting himself to the immigration official here when he landed from the steamer Kyle on April 20, Albert Hann, of Burgeo, Newfoundland, is to be deported, and will be sent back to his home on the Sagona this Thursday evening. Hann arrived here in search of work and failed to appear before the immigration agent and pass the usual inspection. He went to Sydney in search of employment but failed to find any and returned to North Sydney. On Thursday night he broke into the scales office of the N.S.S. Coal Co., at the pier, presumably looking for a place to sleep. He was arrested this morning by chief of police Covans to whom he admitted breaking into the office, but as the scales office is not a dwelling, prosecution, he is not being held on this charge.

ACCEPTANCE ASSURED.

Acceptance of Allied ultimatum, relative to reparations, was expected in Reichstag here to-day, when the body convened, the Centralists and Majority Socialists, as a result of their conferences yesterday, were believed to have definitely aligned themselves in favor of yielding to Entente demands. The People's Party was reported, last night, to have become resigned to the inevitable.

NO OFFICIAL RECOGNITION.

NO OFFICIAL RECOGNITION. LONDON, May 10. There has been no formal recognition of Soviet Government of Russia by Great Britain, and the situation with reference to recognition has not changed since the conclusion of the preliminary Anglo-Russian trading agreement, the Foreign Office announced to-day. It was said in the House of Commons, when negotiations of that agreement were announced, that it was tantamount to recognition. A representative of the Board of Trade went to Russia some weeks ago to make a survey of consular requirements contemplated by the trade agreement, but it will be some time before a consular force can be organized and sent to Russia.

U.S. IN SUPREME COUNCIL.

U.S. IN SUPREME COUNCIL. PARIS, May 9. United States representation at Allied Conference was resumed to-day when Hugh C. Wallace, American Ambassador, took his seat at a session of the Council of Ambassadors here. Mr. Wallace received his instructions last night from Secretary of State Hughes to represent United States Government at Ambassadors Conference. Roland W. Boyden, who formerly sat with the Allied Reparations Committee, has received instructions to resume his seat with that body.
