### Notice! INCOME TAXPAYER !

Returns for the accounting period of 1921 will be due on March 31st, 1922. Persons whose returns are not filed with this department on or before the above date are hereby notified that the negligence penalty as provided by Section 2 of the Act to amend the Income War Tax Act of 1918, shall be added to the assessment of all taxpayers who have not complied with Section seven of the Act. All others to whom forms have been sent under the Eighth section of the Act, as persons suspected as being liable to taxation, are bound to make returns even though they would have no tax to pay. For every default in not making returns under Sections 7 and 8 of the Act, the taxpayer and also the person or persons required to make return, shall each be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of one hundred dollars for each day during which the default

The penalties provided by the sections named apply fiduciaries, executors, guardians and legal represenatives; it also applies to all employers, corporations, associations and syndicates, who are required to forward returns for estates, &c.
