Count of Votes in Referendum, Though Incomplete, Indicates Defeat of Dry Forces—Premier Coates Obtained a Good Majority in the Next Parlia. ment-Woman Candidate Loses Out to Laborite in Recount—Sweeping Victory of Coates' Government Likely to Have Rebound Effect in Australian Contest—Premier Bruce Well Pleased With Result.

Wellington, N.Z., Nov. 5 .- The pro bitionists have not yet succeeded in their efforts to make New Zealand dry. The question whether New Zeashould continue its present liquor license system, adopt "State purchase" or government control of liquor, or swing to prohibition, was voted on in a referendum during resterday's general elections.

The counting of the vote is as yet omplete, but the results thus far certained show approximately that the prohibitionists cast 277,981 votes against 310,596 by their oppon

A SWEEPING VICTORY.

Wellington, N.Z., Nov. 5 .- (Canadian Press via Reuters).-The sweeping victory of the Coates government in the New Zealand election yesterday is regarded as likely to have a rebound effect on the Australian election on November 14.

Premier Bruce, of Australia, is eported to have expressed gratification at the result of the vote in New Zealand, which gives the administration of Hon. J. C. Coates a clear majority of twenty-five over all other parties in the house of represen-

All of the six candidates of the ountry party in New Zealand met defeat yesterday.

Compared with the result of the 1922 election the reform (government) party has a net gain of 17 seats as the result of yesterday's vote, while the Nationalist Party, emposed of former Liberals and Nationalists, have only 12 seats. In the last parliament they had a total of 25 seats. Sir Joseph Ward, who was Premier of New Zealand from 1906 to 1912 and was succeeded in he premiership by the late W. F Massey after having been out of the New Zealand parliament for some vears, ran vesterday as an Independent and was elected.
