## Commercial.

### TURKEY, CHICKEN, SALMON.

A writer in a recent issue of the *Poultry and Produce Trades Chronicle* (London) says: "The farmer tells me that they cannot produce a good turkey and sell it at a profit in Ireland at less than 10s. per lb. I have sampled New Zealand poultry, and a chicken that I had cooked turned out to be one of the finest I ever had. It was a real spring chicken, and its flesh quality continues to be shipped and out Antipodean cousins keep the price down within moderate limits, they can be assured of a ready market. I believe the prices being obtained here are, for the consignments, and weight, 8d per lb; fowls, about 2 to 4 lbs, 12d per lb. The demand is good, and must increase upon one of the most important of the island. I am told that the great satisfaction of buyers from Columbia River salmon, as sent from Glasgow, that orders are being constantly repeated, and Mr. George Christie, of this city, has been the recipient of numerous letters testifying to buyers' appreciation."

### TWENTY CENTS A POUND FOR FROZEN POULTRY.

The development of the American frozen poultry trade to which we called attention a fortnight ago, is proceeding with much success, and, with orders from the provinces and an active demand from London poultryers, Mr. Reid has not the least difficulty in disposing of his consignments. Prime chickens, of about 4 lbs and 5 lbs, have averaged 8d (10c) per lb, and spring chickens 2s each, being nearly 10d (20c) per lb. A further arrival is expected at Leadenhall Market today (Saturday), but, as the supply will be light, and in view of the holidays, roasting chickens will probably advance next week from 1d to 1 1/2d per lb, while broilers, running from 1 lb to 1 1/2 lbs, are expected to average 1s 4d each. There is no doubt about the excellence of this American poultry, or the success of the enterprise. (*Poultry Trade Chronicle*, London, England, April 17.)

### QUALITY TELLS.

We watched a sale in the city for other fruits, and in due course noted the disposal of a small parcel of American russets, ex-New York. They were sold at 11s and 11s 6d per barrel, or a fraction under 4s per bushel, and against these prices were reminded of the Tasmanian apples. The latter went off from 12s to 21s per case (about 40 lbs net) by auction, and each case held about a bushel. These prices show the impetus of the poultry, and at the highest figure this comes out at something like 6d per lb first hand. We know that the city poultry, or rather and thirteenth choice products, and we also know, when we were the first to announce the arrival of the first boat from Australia and Hobart with the apples that have lately arrived, that on account of their superiority alone, in spite of heavy supplies of American apples, they would make their value felt here.
