HELPING CARRIE

May Cost Kansas College \$20,000---Likely to Lose a Bequest---Students Joined in Raids.

Topoka, Kan., May 28.—During Mrs. Nation's crusade here a professor and a score of the students of Washburn College assisted her in destroying property. Recently a rich man died, leaving \$10,000 to Washburn College on the condition that the business men of Topoka contribute a like amount. Tomorrow President Herrick will attempt to secure this amount by subscription, but before he proceeds very far a committee of business men will serve notice on him that he need not expect help for his college while its students violate laws. Some of the houses smashed and injured belong to members of the Congregational Church, which supports Washburn College.

THE INVADERS

Dash of Kritzinger's Commando Checked by Swift Movements of British Columns.

Boer Losses Since May 20 Total 449 in Killed, Wounded or Surrendered---Great Stores of War Material Destroyed at Delagoa Bay.

Cape Town, May 28.—The dash of the Kritzinger invaders of Cape Colony to the south, was checked at Vandevoersburg by the swift movement of Goring's and other columns. The invaders, finding their way barred, swerved to the northeast toward Cloeth. The continued capture of horses by the British is appreciably impairing the Boer mobility. Kritzinger's invaders of Cape Colony captured a British post of 41 men near Maraisburg after a stout resistance.

BOER LOSSES.

London, May 27.—Under date of today Gen. Kitchener reports to the war office as follows: "Since my last telegram on the subject (May 20) the columns report:

Boers killed 63
Boers wounded 26
Boers captured 26
Boers surrendered 85

Total 449
"There have been captured 246 rifles and 2,000 pounds of small arms ammunition, besides a large undetailed capture, including 179 wagons and a number of horses."

GAINS IN ALSACE!

Kaiser Working to Germanize Conquered Province.

William Urges Government Control of the Strasburg University and Asks the Pope's Approval—More Talk About Killing the Kaiser.

Rome, May 28.—Since Wilhelm II.'s first journey to Rome a great change has come about in the relations between the emperor and the Catholics. In every direction the young sovereign was trying to form with the men of the Center a work of national concentration, with his future Weltpolitik and the re-establishment of the empire of the west in view.

AMBITIONS OF THE KAISER.

To detach the holy see from France in order to arrest the ralliement, which Berlin always has fought against as being an attempt to unite French forces; to weaken the universal church, the current of Christian democracy, which he looks upon as a danger for Prussian feudalism; to break up, to do away with the French protectorate in missionary countries, to bring into the service of German colonization the assistance of the missionaries and German hegemony over the old family rulers obedience to the real power—such was his idea.

It is well known with what perseverance and what vigor the Kaiser has tried to make a reality of this grand design.

Little by little, urged on the one side by Cardinal Kopp, prince-bishop of Breslau, the Father Joseph of the sovereign; encouraged, on the other hand, by the German factions at Rome, eager to see the Kaiser introduced into the papal court, the Kaiser has been working to the service of German colonization the assistance of the missionaries and German hegemony over the old family rulers obedience to the real power—such was his idea.

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
