BIRD SANCTUARIES
United States Government Establishes Three in the Far West.

Washington, Feb. 3.—Three new national bird reservations in charge of the department of agriculture have recently been created by the President. Two of these refuges, known as the Hazy Islands and Forrester Island reservations in Alaska, were set aside by executive orders of Jan. 11, and the other, Niobrara reservation in Nebraska by executive order of Jan. 12, making a total of fifty-five bird reservations established to date, eight of which are in Alaska.

Of the new reservations, the first two consist of islands in the Tongass National Forest, in the extreme southern part of Alaska, and are inhabited by colonies of sea birds. Forrester Island (formerly known as Egg Island), in particular contains one of the most extensive bird colonies in Southeastern Alaska, and provides a breeding ground for the rhinoceros auklet, one of the few places where this odd-looking bird is known to breed and its northernmost home.

The opposite extreme of its breeding range is found in one of the bird reservations off the coast of Washington. The islands of both the new Alaska reservations are not agricultural in character and are admirably adapted for the purpose to which they will be applied—safe breeding grounds for interesting birds.

hills to the south. It is in the heart of the prairie-chicken country, and is important as furnishing the only refuge that has been established for this fast-disappearing game bird. The reservation will be tenanted also by sharp-tailed grouse and quail, and offers conditions suitable for a satisfactory range for big game. It is situated within a few miles of Valentine, Neb., and will in time doubtless become one of the points of interest of that region.
