MUCH DAMAGE

CHIMNEYSALLOVER TUMBLE TO GROUND

Buildings in Course of Construction Wrecked by Wind.

Pedestrians in Street Have a Rough Time With Violent Breeze.

For several hours Friday, London found herself in the throes of battle, with an equinoctial gale, which swept almost the whole North American con-tinent. Building in course of construction were razed, roofs lifted off, electric wires broken and tangled, chimneys blown over, windows shattered, fences swept away, and pedestrians driven to shelter. Nobody was seriusly injured, although there were several close calls.

The damage to property will amount to many thousands of dollars. The Telephone Company, the hydro-electric department, the telegraph companies, and others having transmission wires, were heavy losers. The damage on chimneys alone was great, not to speak of the destruction done otherwise.
