Some Choice Butcher Stock Goes as High as \$7.65.

Toronto, April 19.—The market closed firm and steady, sliding fraction over last week's opening prices. There was no picking up at good fresh cattle. These were about the same price as last week according to the quality, anything choice being higher. Dress going as high as \$7.65, but only an odd one or two at that price; the general run of good to medium, \$6.80 to \$7.25; fair to poor, \$6.25 to \$6.75.

Good medium, \$6.25 to \$6.75. Good clear and heavy, from \$7.50 to \$7.65. Good quality fat cows firm and in good condition, \$5.50; extra choice up to \$5.60. Bulls steady, prices quiet. Export feeding cattle firm from \$4.50 to \$5.00.

 Montreal, April 19.—Live stock for sale on the two markets on Wednesday amounted to 115 cattle, 12 sheep and lambs, 325 hogs and 450 calves. The cattle market was cleaned up this morning. One small lot of fairly good steers averaging 1,090 lbs sold for \$5.75. Another small lot of poorer steers brought \$3.25, and common cows \$5.50. Common and medium dairy cows brought from \$3 to \$4, and common bulls \$7 and up.
 Receipts of calves were not heavy, and trading was steady at from \$5 to \$7.
