ably no other town in the country has been so long-suffering in this regard as the Town of Campbellton. At six level crossings within its limits where citizens are confronted with danger every day. Particularly is this true in getting to school on time. When one frequently block all crossings from Andrew to Prince William Streets, causing great inconvenience and annoyance to traffic generally, and very often necessitating a trip up around through the Subway.

The greatest objection from this blocking of trains is the danger to children on their way to school. Time and time again children have been seen to crawl under the cars in order to get to school on time. When one stops to consider the chances the children are taking and the awful consequences that might easily follow, one shudders. This is no heinous crime but an actual fact that can be established by many witnesses. Somewhere later an accident will occur and some family will be plunged into grief at the loss of one of their dear ones. Then an outcry will be raised against the continuance of such a condition of affairs. Let the proper authorities get busy and see to it that something is done to have this Subway project put through, which is really the only feasible plan of overcoming the difficulty.
