The fire is believed to have been started by a short circuit in the electric wiring system of the Sacristic In less than an hour flames which drove the Brothers away from the building were consuming the Sasrictic. pursuant to an Order for Foreclosure A call for help was despatched to the fire department of Quebec and the chief of the brigade, with an engine due to the plaintiff on the mortgage and a company of men was rushed foreclosed herein with its costs to be to the scene on a special train. > little band of volunteers to check it. Seeing that the great Basilica was in grave danger, the Brothers decided to remove everything of value from its interior. Rev. Brother Bruneau himself, at the risk of his life, succeeded in carrying out the precious relics and the statue of St. Anne. The flames entered the Basilica from the monastery through the roof, which the stream of water, being directed on the building, could not reach. In a few moments the fine structure was ablaze from end to end and in an incredibly short space of time the two towers of the Cathedral, which were over one hundred and sixty feet high,

fell to the ground. The monetary loss involved is estimated at \$1,200,000, while the insurance carried will probably reach the sum of \$500,000. DEATH OF SIR JOHN C. EATON

The death of Sir John Creig Eaton, President and head of the T. Eaton Company of Toronto, took place on March 30th, at Toronto, after an illness of about six weeks. While attending to business in Montreal and New York he contracted cold which was followed by pneumonia and later by complications which resulted fatal-

Sir John was in his forty-sixth year Dated at Halifax, N. S., this 9th day of age and was reputed to be Toronto's most wealthy citizen. He succeeded his father as head of the great Eaton firm in 1909, carrying out the father's ideals regarding the business and enlarging them very extensively until their buying or selling establishments almost reached around the

Sir John was particularly noted for his influence toward the enlistment of his own employees and gave full pay to all married and half pay to all single men who would enlist. There were over 3,000 of these volunteers and for this work he spent over \$2,000,000. He also equipped and sent at his own expense a machine

Throughout his short life his gifts have been most generous and varied. built and equipped the Timothy Eaton Memorial Methodist Church of Toronto, one of the finest church edifice's in Canada, to the Y.M.C.A. he had always contributed very largely. In December, 1917, at the Halifax disaster, he at once fitted out and hired a special train loaded with supplies and sent to Halifax, coming along himself to personally attend their distribution. Beside his large mercantile business he was a director of the C.P.R. and the Dominion Bank

and other organizations. He was also noted for his human reatment of his help and introduced in the shops the shorter hours and other improvements for his em-

In 1919 he closed his store entirely on Saturdays during the month of July and August, and made his workng days eight hours only for the balance of the year, and the Saturday half holiday was made throughout the entire year.

Sir John leaves a widow and five hildren, also a mother and two marseveral years ago. The present Vice-President of the company, R. P. Eaton, s a cousin of the deceased.


