A MOCK OYSTER BEACH CAKE, -Mix one quart of flour with one tablespoonful of butter, one good teaspoonful of baking powder and milk sufficient to make a very soft paste. Bake in layers. Scrape some oyster plants and cut into small pieces; then boil in salted water. When tender, remove and mash fine. For one quart of salsify add a tablespoonful of butter, half a teaspoonful of salt and one cupful of milk; put into a buttered dish and set inside the oven until all the sloppy look has disappeared, then spread the layers of cake with it. Good salsify prepared in this way has quite a flavour of oysters, and this cake is nice for hungry
