His Excellency Mgr. Duenas Falciano, Bishop of Laurus, and Delegate Apostolic to Canada, arrived in London Thursday, 26th ult., on a four days' visit to that city.

Mr. Falciano arrived at 11.30 a.m. by P. R. from Toronto, accompanied by his retinue, and by Rev. Father Hayward, of London, who went to Toronto to meet him.
