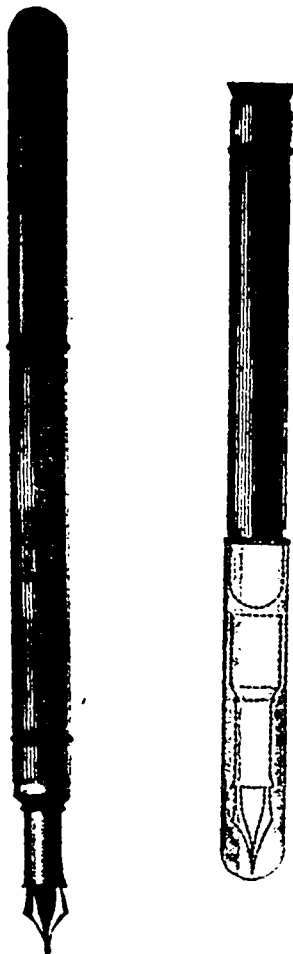

floral wreath, in chromo, 20c., by the Willard Tract Depository.

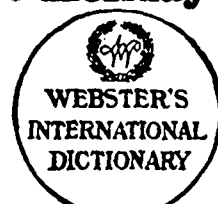
