Anothor man was beaten with nn ron-bound stick, the Zemindar asking betwoen evory blow, "Why havo you become a Christian ${ }^{\prime \prime}$ "Such sal tales were poured into Mr. Batsch's onr ns ho Yet the main feoling was joy tit seeing heir old teacher again, nad the salutation Jeses our holp and protection" burs
till contidently from nill lips: Persecu tion had only ondeared the Christian roligion to theso poor converts. A hun red childron ware wondorfully restored to the Miasion, preserved in the junglo by a Church odilor.
