

As there was no unanimity as specified in Article 21, further action could be taken only under provisions of Article 22 of the Geneva Agreement on Cambodia. Article 22 provides that in cases of differences, a majority and minority report are to be submitted to the Co-Chairmen of the Geneva Delegates' Conference.

The position in brief is that while the Indian and Polish Delegations feel that the International Commission in Cambodia is competent to entertain complaints and reports regarding border incidents involving violation of Cambodian frontiers and to take action thereon, the Canadian Delegation feels that the Commission is competent to deal with cases of violations of frontiers only if these are caused or inspired by the personnel of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. There is thus a fundamental difference of opinion. The number of border incidents reported by the Royal Government of Cambodia to the International Commission is increasing. The Indian and Polish Delegations would be grateful for the Co-Chairmen's instructions in the matter.
