PRAYERS.

Mr. Robb, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Statement of estate receipts and disbursements for the period between December 19, 1910, and December 20, 1926, in the matter of the liquidation of the Farmers Bank of Canada.

The following Bills were, by leave of the House, respectively introduced, read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House, viz:—

Bill No. 30, An Act to amend the Admiralty Act.—Mr. Lapointe. Bill No. 31, An Act to amend the Supreme Court Act.—Mr. Lapointe.

Mr. Bancroft, seconded by Mr. Brown, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 32, An Act to amend the Dominion Elections Act (Voting by Clergymen, Teachers and Students), which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The Bill No. 6, An Act to confirm a certain agreement made between the Canadian Pacific Railway Company and the Canadian National Railway Company, was read the second time and referred to the Select Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines.

The Bill No. 7, An Act to amend The Patent Act, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next sitting of the House.

By leave of the House, on motion of Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), the Order made this day referring the Bill No. 6, An Act to confirm a certain agreement made between the Canadian Pacific Railway Company and the Canadian National Railway Company to the Select Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines, was rescinded.

The said Bill was then considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.
